### Residency requirements

- Complete and present a research project
- Draft a manuscript suitable for publication
- Participate in teaching activities with students and PGY1 residents
- Prepare and present a drug monograph, MUE, and QI project
- Serve as the critical care drug information resident
- Submit an article for the pharmacy newsletter
- Staff a minimum of 35 shifts during the residency year, including some weekends and holidays

### Qualifications

- PharmD degree from an ACPE-accredited college or school of pharmacy
- Completion of an ASHP-accredited PGY1 residency program
- California intern pharmacist license in good standing at time of hire
- Eligible for licensure as a pharmacist in California
